Secretary's Report

AAUW - Faribault Branch Meeting January 25, 2021



President Pauline Schreiber called the monthly meeting on Zoom to order at 7:02 on Jan. 25, 2021. She and our speaker, Sue Garwood, executive director of the Rice County Historical Society, were broadcasting from the Rice County Museum of History. Seventeen members attended.

New Business:

- Pauline reported for Kathy Larson that she had confirmed a date for our annual Halloween Breakfast at the American Legion on Oct. 31st, pending the resumption of normal activities in Faribault.
- Pauline and Julie attended a Zoom meeting with Dave Kirkwood from the Minnesota AAUW Board in December. She reported that AAUW is experiencing a 4-6% loss in membership each year and a subsequent drop in revenue. Our membership dues will increase an additional \$3.00 next year.
- We have 46 members and will hope to add 4 more next year to reach 50.
- Julie Olson thanked members for sending in additional contributions to help us to continue to fund scholarships this year when our fundraising is so limited.

- The book sale will probably be held in the early to late fall.
- The Board and program committee will have a Zoom meeting Monday, Feb. 1st at 2:00 p.m. where we will discuss our participation in the 5 Star Branch program.
- Kathryn Speulda asked for direction for our annual Faribault Daily News articles for Women's History Month. This will also be discussed at the Board meeting on Monday.

Sue Garwood then presented our program, giving an overview of the traveling exhibit: A Century of Civic Engagement: League of Women Voters Minnesota which is at the museum for the month of January. The 12-panel exhibit describes the activism of the League in initially promoting Women's Suffrage and voting rights and then their continued mission to educate voters on candidates, issues and voting regulations.

There followed an interesting discussion on discrimination in the workplace and educational opportunities as well as voting rights. Members shared their experiences with discriminatory practices for women in establishing a credit history, equal pay for equal work, restrictive employment opportunities and lack of family leave with no guaranteed job retention. Because AAUW has had a long history of sponsoring scholarly studies on social issues and challenging discrimination in the courts, members thought this might be a topic for our newspaper articles.

• The meeting resumed when Pat Rice (who was not able to join the meeting on time due to technical difficulties) shared that Liz (Betty) Strohfus will be featured in a Wasp in the Spotlight exhibit at the National WASP WWII Museum in Sweetwater, Texas from March through July. The exhibit unveiling will be held Mar. 20, 2021 with an evening of celebration. Motion by Diane Hagen, second by Pat Rice to encourage members to contribute to a memorial donation to the museum in Betty's honor. The motion carried. Donations can be sent to Julie Olson. Materials from our dedication ceremony for the Liz Wall Strohfus Field at the Faribault airport will also be donated for the exhibit.

The meeting was adjourned.
