Secretary's Report

Minutes for the Oct. 20, 2022 Faribault AAUW Business Meeting

The branch met at 6:30 p.m. Oct. 20, 2022 in the Public Meeting Room in Faribault City Hall. The meeting followed AAUW's third, and final, local

candidates' forum. The Council Chambers had a packed audience for the forum that featured candidates for Rice County sheriff and county attorney. Other forums held were: Oct. 6, District 10 State Senate candidates and Dist.19A State Representative candidates; and on Oct. 13, Rice County District 3 commissioner candidates and Faribault School Board candidates.

The main purpose of the meeting was to pass a 2022-2023 budget. Karen Rasmussen, who had presented the 2021-2022 audit of the branch's finances at the September meeting, had worked with

former Co-president and current Membership V.P. Kathy Larson, and current Co-Presidents Pat Rice and Carmen Tripp, to come up with the budget. She went through it for the membership. Once her presentation was read, and there were questions that were answered, Emily Nesvold made a motion to approve the budget; Barb Dubbels seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Rasmussen and Larson, co-chairs of the Halloween Breakfast, gave a report. The Thrive small-grant cards will be used to pay for placemats, napkins, give-away candy, and some of the cost of the muffins. Larson thanked Rasmussen for writing up an article for the Faribault Daily News on the event which will raise funds for scholarships. She added that members needed to call her by Oct. 23 with their number of pre-sold tickets. Larson needs to call the American Legion on Monday, Oct. 24 with the number of pre-sold tickets so that food can be ordered for the omelet breakfast.

AAWU Funds V.P. Liz Hartman told members that names for 2023 Named Honorees need to be submitted by the beginning of January. She asked members to contact her if they had ideas as to which members to honor.


