### **Secretary's Report May Minutes**



The Faribault AAUW Branch met at 2 p.m. in the Rice County Historical Society Museum's Carlander Program Room on March 25.

Co-president Carmen Tripp convened the meeting. She first asked if there were any corrections to the Secretary and Treasurers' reports printed in the emailed newsletter. Barb Dubbels had spotted a typo in the minutes. With that correction, Tripp deemed the Secretary and Treasurer's reports approved as printed in the newsletter.

Tripp's first item of business was the Minnesota AAUW State Convention which will be April 26 and 27 in Hastings at the Confluence Hotel. Faribault can have up to four delegates. Tripp, Liz Hartman and Karen Rasmussen signed up to attend the event and be delegates. Tripp will be talking to members who did not attend the March meeting to see if there is a fourth member willing to be a delegate. She reported there is money in the budget to pay for the \$130 cost of registration for each of the four delegates.

#### Old Business:

Tri-Branch Luncheon; Preparations have been made for the Tri-Branch Luncheon that Faribault is hosting this year. It will be Saturday, April 20 at the Faribault Country Club. A signup sheet for the event was passed around with an envelope to place \$25 in check or cash for tickets for the luncheon. Julie Olson said members have until April 10 to contact her, if they plan to attend the event. Tripp stressed that the Tri-Branch Luncheon is Faribault AAUW's program for April. There is no other meeting during April.

**Spring Picnic**; Pauline Schreiber reported that the Spring Picnic will be Monday, May 20 (date is wrong in

Yearbook). Pat Umbreit has agreed to host it at her house on Roberds Lake. Arna Farmer will be catering it again. Schreiber asked if members were happy with the food from last year. Members made good comments about it. Pat Rice said that if the cost would be \$17 a plate instead of \$15 like last year, for similar food, a hike in price should be considered. Tripp said there will be an Executive Committee meeting sometime after the Tri-Branch Luncheon to consider the food, pricing and other details about the Spring Picnic.

**Book Sale**; Pat Rice reported that the branch's final book sale will be May 17, 18 and 19 at the West Mall. The sale will sell those books that were stored at the Congregational Parish House basement after last year's sale. Additional books will be collected the week of the sale at the mall. Other details of the event will be worked out by the book sale committee.

**Women in History Articles;** Tripp said the Faribault Daily News has published three of the articles and the final one should be published in the coming week. Pauline Schreiber wrote about Carol Bly; Renee Perrance on Kate DiCamillo; Pat Rice on Louise Erdrich; and Gloria Olson wrote a compilation on five other Minnesota women authors. Kathryn Speulda served as the editor and liaison between AAUW and the newspaper. Tripp thanked them for their work.

Schreiber made a motion to adjourn the meeting; Olson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Speaker;** Sandro and Pisa Hagen gave a presentation about the Republic of Georgia. They are the grandson and daughter-in-law of Faribault AAUW member Diane Hagen. The family moved last year from the Republic of Georgia to Minnesota because of the changing political and economic climate in that Western European country.
