Secretary's Report – February Minutes

The Faribault AAUW Branch met Monday, February 26, 2024 in the Rice County Historical Society's Carlander Program Room. Co-President Mary Niermann convened the meeting. She first asked if there were any corrections or additions to the Secretary's and Treasurer's reports printed in the emailed Branch newsletter. Hearing none, she deemed them approved as printed.

Niermann asked Sue Willcutt, Public Policy co-chair, to give a brief summary of "What to Expect at the Caucus." Minnesota Party caucuses are to be held 7 pm. Tuesday, Feb. 27. Faribault caucuses will be at the Faribault Middle School. Willcutt gave an outline of the purposes of the caucuses, and the procedures at them. They are meant to nominate delegates to the county party convention and to propose resolutions to amend or add to the Party's Platform.

Pauline Schreiber gave a short report on the Women in History Month articles to be published in the Faribault Daily News during March. The topics will be Minnesota women authors and meant as a tribute to Faribault AAUW's many decades of holding an annual used book sale as a fundraiser. The Branch will hold one last book sale this spring. Pat Rice, Renee Perrance and Gloria Olson are writing the other three articles. Kathryn Speulda is editing the articles and has contacted the FDN editor to ask that articles be printed in the newspaper. He has agreed.

Niermann said the Tri-Branch Lucncheon, being hosted by Faribault AAUW, April 20 at the Faribault Golf Club, will use baskets as part of the centerpieces. Many baskets have been collected. Schreiber suggested the members sign up and pay at the March meeting. The event is "the program" for April. There is no general meeting that month.

Also to be noted, the Yearbook has the wrong date for the spring picnic. It will be Monday, May 20 and Pat Umbriet has agreed to host it. It will be a catered meal by Arna Farmer.

The State AAUW Annual Meeting (or Convention) is April 26 and 27 at the Confluence Hotel, 200 Second St. W., Hastings. Niermann has printed out applications for those interested. She said Faribault may have up to four delegates. The selection of the delegates will need to be made at the March 25 meeting.

Membership Chair Kathy Larson said she has sent out a few applications to women who said they are interested in being members, but so far has not received them back.

Old Business

Book sale: Pat Rice, book sale committee chair, was not at the meeting. She is still working on securing a date at the Faribault West Mall for the two-day sale.

The business meeting was adjourned.

Speaker

Chris Martin of Curbside Composting Coop, Northfield gave a presentation on why food and other organic materials should be kept out of general trash going to the landfill. Organic materials such as food scraps, when covered with dirt at the landfill, break down without oxygen with the result that methane gas is created. His company is six years old and collects household and restaurant food

scraps for composting. Currently his company takes the food scraps it collects to another facility for composting. The hope of the company is that it can eventually compost in Rice County. Submitted by Secretary Pauline Schreiber
