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2023 Halloween Breakfast

Things are coming together for the Halloween Breakfast. The end of our presale price (\$15) of the tickets is Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup>, the same day as our meeting. **Please bring any tickets you did not sell and the money for the tickets sold to our 2 pm meeting**. I'm making a spreadsheet of the tickets/money and it would help immensely to have this detail taken care of before we start welcoming our guests on Sunday. New this year: individual assorted flavors of coffee creamers! I ordered a \$250 Thrivent card and with it I have already received 400 placemats, 400 napkins, 400+ assorted candies, mostly chocolate, but also other varieties, and the creamers are on their way. We'll have the usual black tablecloths and Kathy's Halloween treasures for centerpieces. Cleanup will be shorter as there is a Legion-Auxiliary membership dinner the following evening to reuse the tablecloths (I think, but maybe new) and centerpieces. For those working the floor I hope you can ask everyone, guests and members, to make sure that they have been offered a candy. Judy Graham ordered and received another Thrivent card that we will use to get the muffins. Thanks goes out to Gail Kielmeyer for getting the Costco pricing and she and her daughter Krista who are willing to pick them up. We've decided on the Costco bakery as they can make



300 fresh muffins @ \$0.8325/each that are 3.5" in diameter for \$250. The samples we received tasted great and were not as crumbly. **We're planning on three varieties**. Carmen Tripp has received a Kwik Trip gift card for \$50 and Karen Kittlesen, a former member, has donated \$50. So, we should be able to order about 5 dozen or 60 more muffins, individually wrapped. Last year I made a note that 30 dozen would be a good total to have which we can achieve with 360 muffins. The \$600 donated for these various products will certainly help our bottom line. And with three stores with muffins open

Sunday morning, we should be to get extras if we should run low.

Please note the attached work schedule. There are still openings to be filled. Members have always stepped up to the plate to help for a couple hours just one day of the year to have some fun and have an efficient breakfast. This could become our only fundraiser if our Book Sale is discontinued. So it is more important than ever to make this breakfast our best one yet! I believe it will be. We have even more fun dressing in something Halloween-y or a costume. I have a Little Red Riding Hood cape if anyone needs something. Or it could be the devil. And my butterfly wings and antennae...Read above to contact me, first come, first served.

## Secretary's Report

Faribault AAUW met at 2 p.m. Monday, Sept. 25, 2023 in the Carlander Program Room at the Rice County Historical Society. Lead AAUW Co-

President Carmen Tripp convened the meeting. She first asked if there were any additions or corrections to the Secretary's and Treasurer's reports that were printed in the emailed Faribault AAUW September newsletter. Hearing none, they were approved as printed.

Election of 2023-2024 Branch Officers: Tripp presented the slate of nominees: Co-Presidents Carmen Tripp and Mary Niermann; Secretary/Program VP Pauline Schreiber; Co-Treasurers JoEllen Schultz and Karen Rasmussen; Membership VP Kathy Larson; Co-Public Policy VPs Sue Willcutt and Sue Stout; AAUW Funds VP Liz Hartman and Diversity VP Diane Hagen. She asked if there were any other nominations from the floor. Hearing none, Carmen asked for a motion to approve the slate of officers. Bonnie Becker made a motion to approve the slate of officers as presented; Julie Olson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Membership VP Kathy Larson introduced new member Gail Kaderlick and presented her with a Faribault AAUW book bag with information on AAUW along with some treats.

The 2023-2024 proposed Branch Budget, prepared by Rasmussen and Schultz, with input from the Board at its August Planning Session, was presented. Schultz, Rasmussen and Tripp answered questions about the budget from members. Scholarship awards were kept conservative, Schultz said, but could be increased later in the program year if members wished. Since holding a used book sale is "up in the air," there will be only one fund raiser for sure, the Halloween Breakfast. This is why the scholarship amounts were kept conservative. After a bit more discussion, Barb Dubbels made a motion to approve the budget. Kathy Larson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Program VP Pauline Schreiber reported that the October program speaker will be Jason Olson, Faribault High School principal. He will give a presentation on "Diversity and Disciple" at the FHS.

The Christmas party will be at the Cathedral. A location is being sought for the spring picnic.

Pauline introduced the September speaker after the business meeting. Buckham Memorial Head Librarian Delane James presented a "show and tell" program on what is new at the library and spoke of the \$3 million gift to the library from a deceased library patron. A third of the gift will be put into an endowment so the gift will keep on giving.

Karen Rasmussen and Kathy Larson, co-chairs for the Halloween Breakfast, gave a peptalk to members to sell as many pre-sale tickets as they can for the fund raiser. Pre-sale tickets are \$15; tickets at the door will be \$18. Children's tickets will be \$6, either pre-sale or at the door. A sign-up sheet for volunteers for shifts at the breakfast was passed around. A second sign-up sheet was passed around for taking flyers about the breakfast to various locations.

Rasmussen and Tripp, also provided samples of muffins from Kwik Trip and Hy-Vee. Unfortunately, Rasmussen said, Faribault'. Hy-Vee is no longer baking muffins here. The jumble-sized muffins the store sells are baked at a different bakery and sold in packages of four. The Kwik Trip muffins are individually wrapped, but smaller. Members thought the Hy-Vee muffins too big. It was suggested that Fareway Foods Bakery be checked as well as Aldi's and Costco. It was left up to the Halloween Breakfast Committee to find the best deal for muffins. Thrivent cards and a charity deal from Kwik Trip will help pay for muffins and other items for the breakfast.

Other highlights of the meeting:

\* Membership booklet: Pat Umbreit, Yearbook editor, passed out the 2023-2024 Yearbooks to members and asked those attending to take those of members not at the meeting, if they would be seeing them soon. Tripp thanked Umbreit for her hard work in preparing the booklets.

\* Book sale: Tripp told members that no used book sale has been planned for this program year. A short discussion was held by about "aging backs" of members and how much work the sale requires (nearly two weeks with sorting books before sale and holding the sale). She asked members to think about the issue over the next month. A possible vote about whether to hold a sale or not next spring, would be taken at the October meeting.

\* Tri-Branch Luncheon: It is Faribault AAUW's turn to host the Tri-Branch Luncheon. Barb Dubbels and the Program Committee found the Faribault Golf Club as a location and its kitchen will provide the food. The date of Saturday, April 20 has been reserved, at 11:30 a.m. The Committee is considering several speakers for the event and is working on securing one.

\* AAUW Named Honorees: AAUW Funds VP Liz Hartman asked members to think of members to honor as Named Honorees for 2024. For each \$750 to the National AAUW Funds, Faribault can honor a member. The budget has \$1,500 being donated by the Branch to AAUW Funds, so two members can be honored. The names need to be submitted by January. In May, the Branch honored four members because our annual donation was late for the year before. The 2023 named honorees were Kathy Larson and Karen Rasmussen, for their work with the Halloween Breakfast; Sue Olson for her work as social outing coordinator; and Kathryn Speulda for her work as Women In History Month articles editor.
