


## April Program - "Teach what? Says Who"

A program of "Women of Mayo Clinic" was presented by Dr. Pat Raftery, Irene Eiler, and Gloria Olson at the March 27<sup>th</sup> at AAUW's monthly meeting during Women's History Month. Eiler is the great-niece of Maud Headline Mellish Wilson, both raised in the Faribault area. Nurse Maud Mellish was hired by Dr. Will Mayo in 1907 "to organize a library and to do editorial work in connection with the publication of papers." Over the next quarter century, she edited thousands of medical articles by Mayo Clinic physicians and scientists and the Mayo brothers considered her to be a key figure in the development of the clinic's international reputation.

## Faribault AAUW Branch Meeting - March 27, 2023

The branch met at 6:15 p.m. Monday, March 27 at the Rice County Historical Society Museum's Carlander Program Room. Co-presidents Pat Rice and Carmen Tripp convened the meeting.

Rice asked if there were any corrections or additions to the minutes included in the branches emailed newsletter. Hearing none, she asked to a motion to approve the Feb. 27 minutes. Pat Fuches made a motion to approve the minutes; Chrissie Dore seconded the motion.

Treasurer JoElln Schultz included her report in the March newsletter. The branch's balance on its accounts is \$12,938.47. Pauline Schreiber made a motion to approve the treasurer's report; Carmen Tripp seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Rice thanked Kathryn Speulda, head of the Faribault Branches "Women In History Month" articles, for her efforts and thanked the writers of the articles. The article were published in the Faribault Daily News on Tuesdays in March.

Kathy Larson, membership V.P., reported the branch has 48 members. National AAUW dues are increasing, slightly, over the next three years. She will have a report in the April newsletter as to what dues will be for the coming year.

The Spring Picnic, Rice said, will be May 22 at Diane Hagen's. Schreiber, a member of the program committee, said Mary Niermann, chair of the program committee, would be meeting with Arna Farmer, owner of Arna Farmer Catering, to decide on a menu for the Spring Picnic. Like last year, it will be a "catered affair."

Scholarships for the year was brought up. Karen Rasmussen, head of the Scholarship Committee, said the branch is committed to funding two \$750 scholarships to South Central College. Mary Osborn, in charge of the AAUW-sponsored FHS Sportswoman of the Year Award, said there may be a \$250 scholarship to go along with the trophy. Offering local scholarships to women completing their bachelor's degree or doing advanced work, was discussed with various suggestions. Schreiber made a motion to have the branch offer and fund two \$1,500 scholarships this year; Larson seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Rasmussen will come up with a deadline for applying for the local scholarships. Most likely it will either be June 1 or June 15. Applications are online making it quicker and easier for applicants to apply. Rasmussen will also be advertising for applicants in various places.

Diversity V.P. Diane Hagen will report in April on the date for the 2023 Faribault International Festival in Central Park. It will be this summer in July or August. The branch will decide at a later meeting whether members will have an activity at the festival or not.

Tripp collected checks for the Tri-Branch Luncheon set for 11:30 p.m. Saturday, April 22 at Ruth's on Stafford, 410 Stafford Lane, Dundas, hosted by the Northfield AAUW Branch. The deadline to register is April 10. Tripp will be sending in all the checks she collected at the meeting and recording the names to know who from Faribault are going so carpooling can be arranged. The speaker will be a Carleton College professor speaking on, "Title IX: Where We Stand Today."

Delegates to the online, Zoom, Minnesota AAUW Annual Meeting on April 29 were selected. They are: Liz Hartman, Karen Rasmussen, Carmen Tripp and JoEllen Schultz. Schreiber made the motion to approve the delegates; Speulda seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Schultz made a motion to adjourn the meeting; Fuchs second the motion. The motion carried.
