Secretary's Report May Minutes

The Faribault AAUW Branch met at 6:15 p.m. Monday, April 24, 2023, in the Rice County Historical Society's Carlander Program Room. Copresidents Pat Rice and Carmen Tripp convened the meeting. Twenty members attended.

March minutes were printed in the April newsletter. No corrections or additions were noted.

Treasurer JoEllen Schultz gave the treasurer's report. The Branch has \$12,111.08 in its checking and savings accounts.

Karen Rasmussen, scholarship committee chair, will be sending out invitations to apply for the Faribault Branch Local Scholarships. Two \$1,500 local scholarships were approved at the March meeting. Those who apply need to have at least 24 college credits and be enrolled for the next semester at a college. Women doing master or doctorate work can also apply. Scholarship checks are written to both the college and student. If the recipient does not use it for college, the check cannot be cashed. The Branch is also committed to giving two \$750 scholarships for women attending South Central College.

Membership Vice President Kathy Larson announced that national AAUW dues are going up. The dues for the 2023-2024 program year will be \$91, of which \$72 will go to the national AAUW, and \$19 to state and branch. "Shape the Future" dues for new members will be \$55, of which \$36 goes to national and \$19 to state and branch. All but \$3 of dues are tax deductible.

Mary Niermann, Program V.P., announced that the spring picnic will be 6 p.m. Monday, May 22 at Diane Hagen's home. It will be catered again by Anna Farmer Catering at the cost of \$15 per member. A signup sheet was passed around. Members need to sign up in advance, but can pay on the night of the picnic. For auditing purposes it was suggested that members write two checks; one for dues and one for the picnic meal. Both can be made out to Faribault AAUW. Cash for the meal will be accepted.

Niermann, also, announced that she would not lead the Program Committee for the 2023-2024 programming year because of her duties as a member of the Buckham West Senior Center Board. She will continue to be a member of the Program Committee.

Diane Hagen, Diversity V.P., announced that the Faribault 2023 International Festival will be Saturday, July 8 in Central Park. A committee was formed to come up with ideas for activities the branch could sponsor that day. Emily Nesvold and Sue Stout volunteered to be on the committee with Hagen. It was, also, suggested that Rene Perrence, a member who has helped with Branch activities at the International Festival in the past, be contacted to be on the committee.

Pat Rice reported that she has arranged for minimum security prisoners from the Faribault prison to move the books on Wednesday, May 10, from storage in the Congregational Parish House basement to the Faribo West Mall. Bonnie Becker will provide a van for the move. Liz Hartman, who volunteered to sign up member volunteers for sorting books and shifts at the used book sale, passed around a signup sheet. The sale is May 18-23. Rice, also, contacted KDHL Radio, and will be on the radio to promote the sale.

Carmen Tripp announced that Liz Harman had volunteered to host those members who will be viewing the Minnesota AAUW annual meeting on "Zoom" on Saturday, April 29. She thanked Liz for doing so.

Tripp added that the Faribault Branch had the most members attending the 2023 Tri-Branch Luncheon April 22, hosted by the Northfield Branch at "Ruth's on Strafford" in Dundas. Fifteen Faribault members attended. The food was excellent. The program was presented by Laura Riehle-Merrill, Title IX coordinator for Carleton College of Northfield. She spoke of how much of her work is about sexual harassment and abuse prevention, or helping students who've encountered either.

Kathy Larson reported that the Branch's application to the Faribault Chamber of Commerce's "Hometown Heros" program, to honor member May Bottke, 98, has been accepted. May Bottke is a treasure to not only the Faribault Branch, but the entire community, for her many years of "giving back" by playing her keyboard or piano for musical programs at senior housing complexes, nursing homes, senior centers, and many other events. She, also, had a 40 year teaching career and put on an annual Kindergarten Circus at Lincoln Elementary School. Her "Hometown Heroes" banner should be up around Memorial Day, either on Fourth Street or Downtown.

It was announced that the spring quarterly birthday party will be 1 p.m. Wednesday, May 3 at the Signature Bar and Grill.

The monthly coffee will be 10:30 a.m. Saturday, May 20 at Janna's Market.

Pauline Schreiber made a motion to adjourn the meeting; JoEllen Schultz seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Following the business meeting, Katie Rotvold, Director of Curriculum and Instruction for the Faribault Public Schools, spoke to Branch members about what is being taught in the Faribault Public Schools and about state standards.


