Minutes for the Nov. 24, 2025 Faribault AAUW Business Meeting

The Faribault Affiliate met at 2 pm. Nov. 25, 2025 at the Rice County Historical Society. President JoEllen Schultz conducted the meeting. She asked if there were any corrections or additions to either the Secretary's or Treasurer's reports that were printed in the branch emailed newsletter. Hearing none, Schultz declared both approved.

Treasurer Karen Rasmussen gave a final report on the Halloween Breakfast Fundraiser. After expenses, the Branch net \$3,834. Kathy Larson reported sending a "thank you" to the crew from the Sons of the Legion who made the omelets for the breakfast. Members thanked Larson and Rasmussen, the co-chairs of the event, for their hard efforts and attention to details that helped make it a great success. Karen Rasmussen, also, reported a change in State Bank of Faribault's procedures meant to prevent fraud in business accounts. She has signed the Affiliate up for online banking, which she is capable of doing. Otherwise there would be a \$100 charge, a month, for the procedures the bank will be using to prevent fraud, starting next year.

Pauline Schreiber, program V.P./secretary, passed around a sign-up sheet for the Monday, Dec. 15 Holiday Party. It will be at the Cathedral of Our Merciful Savior's and the Women of the Cathedral will be providing the meal. The cost is \$15. 

Financial Report as of 12/10/2025:

- Checking account balance \$12,987.21.
 - \$1500, as budgeted, paid for "Greatest Need Fund" (all donations by 12/31/2025 to be matched/doubled!) But there is a \$10 charge per \$500 for using credit card, however, I could see no other way of paying.
 - 27 members have committed to going to the 12/15 Christmas Luncheon.
 - Another \$150 has been designated for the Halloween Breakfast for a current total of \$3,984.70—less than the cost of a Christmas lunch to break \$4000!
 - Silent Auction ~ deposited \$220, \$174 was bid items and \$46 in donations.
 - Positive Pay will take effect 1/1/2026 (no cost to affiliate to help prevent check fraud, but more work for check writer(s)).
 - Not counting members who have told us they do not intend to renew, we have Mary Ann Godwin, Sue Willcutt and Wendy Williams as expired members. If anyone talks to them, find out if they intend to maintain their membership.
- Renewals are now treated as a calendar year, rather than July 1 st to June 30 th , though technically the new year for memberships starts April 1 st . So, the membership roster currently has 36 members.
